Be Safe and Sober this St. Patrick's Day

La Habra, Calif. – If you are celebrating St. Patrick's Day, remember to do so responsibly by having a plan to get home safely.

This St. Patrick's Day (March 17), the La Habra Department will have officers on patrol from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. looking for drivers suspected of driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

"If drinking is part of your plans, plan on designating a sober driver and find a safe way home," the La Habra Police Department, Corporal, Tonya Sauer said. "Don't make poor choices and allow yourself to mix alcohol or drugs with driving."

On St. Patrick's Day 2019 in California, seven people were killed, and 116 others were injured in crashes caused by driving under the influence.

Not only does driving under the influence put yourself and others on the road at risk, but it also hurts financially; attorneys' fees, fines, court costs, insurance rate hikes and car repairs can reach \$15,000 or more in California.

"It's simple: don't drink and drive," Corporal Sauer said. "Stay at home or find a sober driver to take you home."

California's public health guidance advises to limit mixing with people you don't live with as much as possible to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.
